Barry Moore is an internationally recognised authority in the field of government policy formulation and evaluation across a wide range of economic policy issue. Before joining the Department of Applied Economics (DAE) in the University of Cambridge in 1970, he worked both industry and the financial services industry in London. At the DAE he worked as a member of a team of economists concerned with developing medium term forecasting models for the UK economy and its regions.

He has been advisor to various government departments and a special advisor to the House of Commons Select Committee on Welsh Affairs. He has also directed the evaluation of government economic development programmes including regional policy, enterprise zones, transport policy, science and technology policy, and tourism. In addition, he has advised the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) on Science Parks, urban and regional policy and issues relating to high technology industry.

Recent research includes a major study for the Higher Education Funding Council (HEFCE) of technology transfer policy in universities and a study for the government of innovation in the Design Engineering Sector. He has also worked on industrial policy in developing countries notably Ghana.

His current research interests lie in the areas of small firms and innovation, higher education and technology transfer and high-technology clusters.

Barry Moore has published in a number of major economic journals including the *Economic Journal*, *Economica*, *Urban Studies*, *Regional Studies*, *the Cambridge Journal of Economics* and *the Journal of Regional Science*. He has also authored a number of reports for government departments, the European Commission and the OECD.
